87th ANNUAL PIAA INDIVIDUAL WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIPS

MECHANICSBURG - The 2024 PIAA Individual Wrestling Championships are scheduled to be contested at the Giant Center in Hershey, PA starting Thursday, March 7th, 2024 through Saturday, March 9th, 2024. This is the 87th Annual PIAA Individual Wrestling Championships.

The Individual Wrestling Championships will have 728 student-athletes competing for a state title. The tournament will begin with Session I on Thursday, March 7th with preliminary, first round, and first round consolations. Session II/III will include quarterfinals, second round consolation, third round consolation and semifinal matches are scheduled for Friday, March 8th. Session IV/V will be fourth round consolation, fifth round consolation final, and championship matches and are scheduled for Saturday, March 9th.

GIRLS WRESTLING

History is set to be made with the inaugural PIAA Individual Girls Wrestling Championships. The PIAA Board of Directors approved girls wrestling last year. In May 2023, Pennsylvania became the 38th state to sanction girls wrestling. J. P. McCaskey from District III was the first school to sponsor a girls' wrestling team, which led to over 100 schools, in three years and two months, sponsoring girls' wrestling. With a unanimous vote by the Board on all three readings, girls wrestling became an official PIAA sport in PA.

There will be a stout representation of girls' wrestlers for the first championships with 208 student-athletes competing for a state title. There will be 16 girls wrestling in each of the 13 weight classes.

BOYS CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

The first championship was held in 1938 at Rec Hall at Penn State University. The championships were held in Happy Valley from 1938-1946. The championship site moved a few times before returning to Rec Hall. It was held at West Side Armory, Kingston, Pa from 1947-1948, McCaskey High School in District III in 1949, Washington High School in District VII in 1950, and Cambria County War Memorial Arena in Johnstown, Pa in 1951. The individual wrestling championships moved back to Rec Hall from 1952-1969. In 1970, the championships moved to the Farm Show Arena in Harrisburg. Student-athletes competed at the Farm Show Arena for one year. The championships went back to Rec Hall in 1971 then spent two consecutive years at the Farm Show complex from 1972-1973.

In 1974, this was the first year for two separate classifications. It was originally called "Class A" and "Class B." The championships were held at two sites, at Rec Hall for "Class A" and the Farm Show Arena for "Class B". This was the only time, in the history of the championships, the classifications competed at different sites. The following year, in 1975, the championships took place at Rec Hall until 1978.

The PIAA Wrestling Championships moved to Chocolatetown in 1979 and has never left. From 1979-2002, the individual wrestling championships were held at the Hersheypark Arena, additionally known as the "Old Barn." In 2003, the championships moved to the, at the time, newly built Giant Center. From then on, Giant Center has been the home to the PIAA Wrestling Championships for the past 20+ years.

After two years of being classified as "Class A" and "Class B," AA and AAA were established in 1976. That same year, the first two teams were crowned PIAA Team Champions, after tallying the results of the individual wrestler's results. The inaugural individual team champions were Reynolds in 2A and Saucon Valley in 3A.

The 2A and 3A Individual Championships will see 520 student-athletes wrestling for a state title, with 20 boys wrestling in each of the 13 weight classes for a total of 728 student-athletes wrestling on the PIAA stage.
