89th ANNUAL PIAA SWIMMING AND DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS

MECHANICSBURG - The 2024 PIAA Swimming and Diving Championships took place at Kinney Natatorium at Bucknell University, Lewisburg. Nine new PIAA records were set over the four-day event during the 89th PIAA Swimming and Diving Championship.

Swimmer of the Meet: Annie Jia, Hatboro-Harsham

NOTES: Hatboro-Horsham HS Annie Jia broke her own record in the 100 Butterfly. Jia won four gold medals. Mt. Lebanon HS Sylvia Roy set a new PIAA and Bucknell University Pool Record in the 100 Backstroke.

Swimmer of the Meet: Joseph Gardner, Mt. Pleasant

NOTES: Mt. Pleasant HS David Mutter set a record in the 100 Butterfly. Breaking the record first in the prelims and again in the finals. Two swimmers swam under the old record in the 100 Backstroke with North Catholic's Luke Lamb setting the new record. Mt. Pleasant's Joseph Gardner broke his own record, set last year, in the 100 Breaststroke. In the 200 Freestyle Relay, Blue Mountain HS Noah Powers set a record with his lead off split of 19.82 seconds. That record now stands as the current 50 Free record.

Swimmer of the Meet: Leah Shackley, Bedford Area HS

NOTES: Three new state records were set during the competition. Bedford Area's Leah broke two of her former records in the 100 Butterfly and the 100 Backstroke. Shackley's 100 Backstroke record also sets a new Bucknell University Pool record. Mt. Pleasant HS Lily King broke her own record, set last year, in the 100 Free. King first broke the record in the prelims and then again in the finals.

NFHS RECORDS

Student-athletes competing at the PIAA Swimming and Diving Championships have not only excelled, setting state records and pool records but also setting National Federation of State High School Association (NFHS) records. Currently, there are three NFHS records set by PIAA student-athletes.

- David Nolan Hershey HS: 200 IM and 100-yard freestyle. Both set in 2011.
- North Allegheny HS: 400-yard Freestyle Relay set in 2018.
