NFHS and PIAA Board of Directors Approve Change to Swim Suits, Effective for the 2009-10 Season



Technical swimsuits were introduced to the world of swimming approximately two years The adago. vanced technolfundamenogy

tally altered the sport, and swimwear became more of a piece of equipment as opposed to a uniform.

The rules of swimming have

always prohibited the wearing or use of an item that would aid in the swimmer's speed or buoyancy. The technical suits have evolved with little or no regard for these basic rules.

In order to preserve the integrity, tradition, and heritage of the sport, as well as protect and enhance the interscholastic swimming program, the new requirements and restrictions on swimwear are necessary to promote the educational values of high school athletics by promoting fair play. The immediate implementation date will guarantee fairness in competition throughout the high school swimming seasons and allow the meet officials to fairly and consistently enforce the rule.

Extension of NFHS Field Hockey Rule 1-6-4:

Effective with the 2009 season, a visible permanent label was to be affixed to a player's stick indicating compliance with NFHS Field Hockey Rule 1-6-4.

From the beginning of this season, it has been a challenge for individual players and schools to obtain proper labeling from field hockey stick manufacturers.

In an effort not to create a disadvantage to member state associations or undue hardship to their member schools, the NFHS is extending the implementation of NFHS Field Hockey Rule 1-6-4 until January 1, 2010. The NFHS has made it clear, that following the conclusion of the 2009 season, there will not be another extension granted after January 1, 2010.

Please note: The intent of this rule does not include the goal-keeper's stick. The rule is for the field player's stick only.

Schedule Change for the PIAA East Region Golf Championships

Due to a scheduling conflict with the host course, Golden Oaks Golf Club, Fleetwood, PA, the PIAA East Region Golf Championships will be held on Tuesday, October 20, 2009. Previously, PIAA had scheduled the event for Wednesday, October 21, 2009.

The PIAA West Region Championships schedule is unaffected, and will be played at Tom's Run Golf Course, Chestnut Hill Golf Resort, Blairsville, PA, on Wednesday, October 21, 2009 as originally scheduled.

The 2009 season marks the fourth year of regional play in golf for both the girls' and boys' Team and individual events.

32 girls' and 64 boys' individual qualifiers along with 6 Teams of both boys and girls will attempt to qualify for the finals from the East Region. 25 girls' and 50 boys' individual qualifiers and 6 Teams in each gender will attempt qualification from the West Region.



This year's PIAA Team and Individual Golf Championships are schedule for Heritage Hills Golf Resort and Conference Center, York, PA, on Monday October 26 and Tuesday, October 27, 2009.

NFHS Clarification on Field Markings for Football

The PIAA Office has received numerous inquiries regarding a new clarification on field markings in the sport of football published in the 2009 NFHS Football Rules Book.

Rule 1-2-3b Note 2 provides the following: If the field of play has a logo in the center or at any other part of the field of play, that logo should not distract from the visibility of the required marks every five yards. A solid or shadow-bordered 4-inch-wide line is permissible. A shadow line is a line that designates the required 4inch width by use of a border or outline lines, at least ¹/₄-inch wide which shall lie within the 4-inch width. Shadow lines that are the natural color of the field of play are permissible. The area within these lines need not be one color, but the continuous 4-inch-wide outline must be clearly visible to the officials.

Rule 1-2-3 has always provided that that yard lines were to be continuous unbroken line every five beginning and ending 4 inches from each sideline. If a center logo was to be included on the field of play, the rule still stipulated that the 50 yard line was to be continuous, and not break for the logo on opposite sides of the field.

The rule is consistent with the NFHS Basketball Rules Book in that the dividing line for the court is to be an unbroken line.

The clarification in the 2009 NFHS Football Rules Book provides guidance on how school fields may become compliant with the Rule. Through the use of a shadow line or border line through the logo, the field will meet specifications of the Rule, providing clear markings for the officials administering the Contest.

On Thursday, August 27, 2009 all PIAA-registered sports officials' identification cards were mailed to all active and in good standing with PIAA, registered officials.

Some PIAA-registered sports officials, as of Friday, September 4, 2009, have informed the PIAA Office they were not in receipt of their ID card.

To assist in alleviating any problems with schools in demonstrating an initial registration date, officials may access the PIAA officials' database through the PIAA Web site and print their officials' profile with all the appropriate information. This profile will suffice until officials receive their original identification card from the PIAA Office.

To access the officials' database, officials are to sign in utilizing the first four letters of their last name, and the last four digits of their PIAA officials' registration number.

Schools may also access this information through the officials' database and print any contracted official's profile for their records if an official is not in receipt of their ID card at the time of the Contest.
