NFHS Citations are presented annually to outstanding athletic directors in recognition of contributions to interscholastic athletics at the local, state, and national levels. State associations nominate athletic directors for NFHS Citations, and the NFHS Board of Directors approves recipients.

The request must include the sex, the sport(s) and the upgraded class(es) in which the member senior high school desires to compete. Member senior high schools are advised that upgrading of sports' enrollment classification(s) is a commitment of both school years of the two-year classification cycle.
