

**Pennsylvania Native Dee Kantner Recognized in NFHS Magazine as one of
the First Females to Officiate in a Men's Professional League**

Dee Kantner is a notable figure in the collegiate and professional basketball officiating world and is best known for her rise to become one of the first females to officiate in a men's professional sports league. Dee Kantner attended Exeter HS where she earned 13 varsity letters. She received an athletic scholarship to attend the University of Pittsburgh. She started officiating basketball in 1982 during her senior year at Pitt and fell in love with it. She quickly climbed the officiating ranks and in 1992 she worked her first final four assignment. On November 5th, 1997 Kantner entered the history books as she took the court to officiate an NBA game between the Atlanta Hawks and Philadelphia 76ers. **NFHS Foundation Approves Grant to Distribute Wet Bulb Globe
Thermometers to High Schools**

The NFHS has announced a grant program to distribute 5,000 wet bulb globe thermometers to high schools across the country. Wet bulb globe thermometers measure heat stress in direct sunlight, accounting for temperature, humidity, wind speed, sun angle and cloud cover. High schools can use the thermometer's reading to help determine if the weather is appropriate to hold outdoor activities. PIAA will be receiving a shipment of 375 wet bulbs. Wet bulbs will be distributed on a first come first serve basis. We ask that those schools that do not have a wet bulb thermometer make the first request. After we distribute to schools that do not have them we will assess how many we have left and ask schools if they are in need of an additional wet bulb thermometer.
