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2024-2025 and 2025-2026 Classification Reports Posted

The classification reports by sport for the 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 school years have been posted to the PIAA website. Every odd-number year enrollment numbers are submitted by member schools. Enrollment numbers are submitted by gender and include grades 9, 10, and 11 for all students, including all Cyber Charter School and Home-Schooled Students; all students attending an Alternative School, a Magnet School, or a Vocational-Technical school; and all students attending a Charter School who are eligible at a school in the school district of their residences. The Classification Reports do not include those that choose to voluntarily upgrade or those who may move up in classification due to the competition formula.
