# 2<sup>ND</sup> ANNUAL PIAA SPRING FESTIVAL AT PENN STATE

MECHANICSBURG – To celebrate the conclusion of the Spring Sports Season, the 2024 PIAA Spring Festival took place at Penn State University, June 13 through June 15, 2024. With three days of competition, 18-team champions were crowned in four different sports. The Baseball and Softball Championships kicked off the first two days. The Baseball Championships were held at Meldar Field, the home of the State College Spikes, and the Softball Championships were held at Beard Field at Nittany Lion Softball Park. The final day saw action from girls' and boys' lacrosse and boys' volleyball. The Lacrosse Championships were held at Panzer Stadium, while boys' volleyball took place at the historic Rec Hall.
