PIAA "Official Ball" Adoptions

The new adoptions will go in effect July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2029.

MECHANICSBURG, PA – The Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association, Inc. (PIAA) is pleased to announce the "Official Ball" adoptions in six sports. The new adoptions will go in effect beginning July 1, 2025, and will continue for four (4) years through June 30, 2029. The "Official Ball" adoption will include these sports: baseball, basketball, football, soccer, softball and volleyball. This

PIAA received proposals for "Official Ball" adoption from various manufacturers by the stated deadline of 4:00 p.m., Wednesday, January 15, 2025. The PIAA Board of Directors unanimously voted to accept the recommendation of the Administrative Staff. They completed a comparative analysis, to award the "Official Ball" status in each sport as follows:

Member schools may elect to participate with the National Federation of State High School Associations, (NFHS) approved ball of their choice during Regular Season Contests. For postseason play in PIAA District and Inter-District Championship contests, qualifying schools are required to compete with the PIAA Championships' "Official Ball" provided for use.
