

**SUMMARY OF PIAA BOARD OF DIRECTORS' ACTIONS FROM THE
MEETING OF WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2025**

1. The Board heard public comment regarding girls' flag football rule adoptions.
2. Approved the minutes of the July 16, 2025, meeting of the Board of Directors.
3. Held an executive session to discuss personnel matters, active litigation and a legislative update.
4. Addressed the following recommendations, reports and updates from the Executive Director:
 - The Board approved Legal Counsel to enter the consent order to be submitted to the Court regarding the Religious Rights Foundation of PA.
 - The Board approved, on a **second reading basis**, to modify Article III, Section 6. Charter School, Cyber Charter School and Private Faith Based School Students, and add to the Glossary, a definition of a Private Pennsylvania Faith Based School.
 - The Board discussed the initial Basketball Scrimmage date for the 2025-2026 season. No action taken.
 - The Board received information on the retirement of a PIAA staff member and the recently completed application process.
 - The Executive Director announced an agreement between PIAA and PA Association of Broadcasters to work together in developing public service announcements and broadcasting opportunities and audio discounts for PAB members.
