**Mechanicsburg, PA** — PIAA is proud to announce that two coaches have been selected as the NFHS Section 2 Coaches of the Year for the 2024–2025 school year: **Randy Wilson**, Boys' Cross Country Coach at Central Cambria High School, and **Gino Miraglia**, Girls' Soccer Coach at Strath Haven High School.

This year, 39 states participated in the NFHS Coach of the Year program, with 997 coaches recognized nationwide with state, sectional and national honors: 175 with sectional honors.

“On behalf of the PIAA Board of Directors, PIAA member schools, registered officials, and administrators, we want to congratulate our two Sectional Coaches of the Year. These individuals have devoted countless hours to our student-athletes, and we can’t thank them enough for their leadership,’ said **Jennifer Grassel**, PIAA Senior Associate Director of Member Schools and Sport. ‘Coaches are the backbone of our athletic programs. They dedicate their time and leadership to our student-athletes, helping them learn valuable life lessons through competition and athletics.”

Over the past nine years, PIAA has recognized more than 190 coaches through the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Coach of the Year program. Of those honorees, more than 47 have gone on to earn Section Coach of the Year recognition. These awards are determined by the geographic sections in which states are grouped. NFHS is divided into eight sections nationwide, with Section 2 – Mid-East including Delaware, Washington, D.C., Kentucky, Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia.

PIAA is especially proud that three of its Section Coaches of the Year have gone on to earn NFHS National Coach of the Year honors:

- **2020–2021:** Ron Insinger (Loyalsock HS), NFHS National Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year
- **2021–2022:** William Pfeifer Jr. (Moon HS), NFHS National Girls' Soccer Coach of the Year
- **2023–2024:** David Kuhn (Peters Township HS), NFHS National Boys' Golf Coach of the Year
