4th ANNUAL PIAA SPRING FESTIVAL IN HAPPY VALLEY

MECHANICSBURG, Pa. – The 4th Annual PIAA Spring Festival brought another successful spring sports season to a close at Penn State University from June 11–13, 2026. Over three days of championship competition, 18 state titles were awarded across four sports. The event brought together the Commonwealth’s top teams, coaches, and communities for a memorable celebration of athletic excellence, sportsmanship, and achievement.

The festival began with the PIAA Baseball and Softball Championships. Baseball title games were played at the picturesque Medlar Field at Lubrano Park, home of the State College Spikes, while softball champions were crowned at Beard Field at Nittany Lion Softball Park. The championship weekend concluded on Saturday with the PIAA Girls’ and Boys’ Lacrosse Championships at Panzer Stadium and the PIAA Boys’ Volleyball Championships at the historic Rec Hall.

The Spring Festival once again highlighted the partnership between the PIAA and Penn State University, providing a first-class championship experience and a fitting conclusion to the 2025-26 spring sports season.
