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PIAA ANNOUNCES SPRING CHAMPIONSHIP SITES THROUGH 2030

The PIAA Board of Directors approves of six PIAA Spring Championship sites for the next four spring sports seasons.

MECHANICSBURG, Pa. – The Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association, Inc. (PIAA) Board of Directors has approved the host sites for its Spring Sport Championships for the next four-year championship cycle, 2026-27, 2027-28, 2028-29 and 2029-30 school years seasons, reaffirming partnerships with two of Pennsylvania's premier collegiate institutions.

Following the PIAA's Request for Proposal (RFP) process, Shippensburg University has been selected to host the PIAA Track & Field Championships, while Penn State University will continue to serve as the home of the PIAA Baseball, Softball, Boys' Volleyball, and Boys' and Girls' Lacrosse Championships and the Hershey Racquet Club will continue to host Boys' Team and Individual Tennis.

The selected championship sites include:

- **PIAA Track & Field Championships** – Seth Grove Stadium, Shippensburg University
- **PIAA Boys' Tennis Championships** – Hershey Racquet Club, Hershey
- **PIAA Baseball Championships** – Medlar Field at Lubrano Park, Penn State University
- **PIAA Softball Championships** – Beard Field at Nittany Lion Softball Park, Penn State University
- **PIAA Boys' Volleyball Championships** – Rec Hall, Penn State University
- **PIAA Boys' & Girls' Lacrosse Championships** – Panzer Stadium, Penn State University

"The PIAA is proud to continue its longstanding relationships with Shippensburg University, Penn State University and the Hershey Racquet," said PIAA Executive Director **Mark E. Byers**. "These outstanding institutions have consistently demonstrated a commitment to providing first-class championship venues and an exceptional experience for our student-athletes, coaches, officials, and fans as we continue to celebrate the very best of high school athletics in Pennsylvania."

For five decades, Shippensburg University has served as the home of the PIAA Track & Field Championships, welcoming thousands of the Commonwealth's finest student-athletes each spring. Its outstanding facilities, experienced event staff, and tradition of excellence have made the championship one of the premier high school track & field events in the nation.

Penn State University will continue to host the four championships on campus, creating a unique championship atmosphere while showcasing Pennsylvania's top teams and student-athletes at world-class facilities. The PIAA Spring Festival will be split into two weekends, reverting to the traditional dates for Boys' Volleyball and Boys' and Girls' Lacrosse. Baseball and Softball will be contested the following week to close out the scholastic year.

The Hershey Racquet Club will continue to host the PIAA Boys' Individual and Team Tennis Championships. Student-athletes will again have the opportunity to compete in the indoor facility for the championships.
